The Bishop asks Persome to give the guest company at dinner. The convict eats greedily and throws a bone on the floor. Persome leaves the Bishop with the condemned and goes to her room. Then the convict tells his story. Convict tells his tragic story since the convict had a small hut and a wife. Then came the bad year. He was unemployed and had no money. Your wife Jeanette got sick.
